Repeat at National 5K XC

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - For the third consecutive year, the USA Masters 5K Cross-Country Championships were held at historic Saratoga State Park, Oct. 15, with results very familiar to those who watched the 2005

Brian Pope (15:25) and Carmen Ayala-Troncoso (17:19) successfully defended their titles, once again turning in the top times of the meet.

Pope, 43, Oxford, Miss., pushed the pace early and had enough at the end to pull away to a three-second win over Michael Payson, 43, Oxford, Me.

Payson led his Diringo RC team (48 points) to a convincing win in the M40+ team competition over the defending champion Genesee Valley Harriers (76).

According to the men's age-graded winner David O'Keeffe (91.7%), 47,

Pope, Ayala-Troncoso Anta de Miguel, Vasseur Top **Masters in NYC Marathon**

Foreign masters men were again dominant, winning every division except the M80-89, in the ING New York City Marathon on Nov. 5. The U.S. women fared better, but the first W40+ was again a foreign runner.

Last year, the first masters were Spanish and Ukrainian. In 2004, both of the first-place masters were Italian, and in 2003 the M40 winner was Kenyan, and the W40+ first was

This year, Manuel Anta de Miguel, 40, maintained the Spanish hold on the title with a 2:24:14. Peder Troldborg, of Denmark, 43, third (2:26:58) in 2005, was two minutes back with a 2:26:14. Benjamin Reynolds, 42, of Great Britain, was the third master (2:26:32). Joe McVeigh, 43, of New Jersey, was the first U.S. finisher

At the halfway mark, Anta de Miguel was over a minute (1:11:43) ahead of Troldborg (1:12:36). Both were behind Philippe Remond, 43, of France, who hit that point in 1:10:30, but ended up 10th (2:33:12) of the 4912 finishers in the M40-44 division.

Three M40+ winners who were sec-



Randy Sturgeon, 54, has been a runner for 40 years and a coach for 30. Recently retired from the State of California Department of Toxic Substances Control, he will devote full time to the magazine.

He is perhaps better known as the developer and head coach of the Sacramento-based Brooks Fleet Feet Racing Club, which has had tremendous success the last two years, winning the National Masters Team Outdoor Championships in Honolulu and Charlotte, N.C.

His background includes extensive experience in publishing, writing, advertising, broadcasting, race directing, and public relations. In the early '80s, he was the editor of a small Northern California publication, The Running Scene, which was dropped when the owners found they could turn a better profit by concentrating on race

Huntsman Celebrates 20th Year

ST. GEORGE, Utah - Carol Lafayette-Boyd isn't a regular participant at the Huntsman World Senior Games. But she may become one after winning six gold medals in the W60 division at this year's event, its 20th, held Oct. 9-11. Included among her marks was a U.S. record in the triple jump, but it doesn't count as such, because she is a Canadian.

Taking just one jump, Lafayette-Boyd recorded a mark of 8.10/26-7, eclipsing the old mark of 26-5. That record will, of course, remain until an American breaks it, wherever and whenever that may be.

"I first took it up five years ago when I was here," said Lafayette-Boyd, who

was married to an American and lived part of her life in the United States. "I hadn't done it since I was 18. I won, so I decided this is my sport."

Her other marks, all meet records during this 20th anniversary of the Games, included 6-0 1/4 in the standing long jump, 13-0 in the long jump, 7.81 in the 50m, 29.77 in the 200, and 14.42 in the 100

Lafayette-Boyd said she resumed competition at age 50 when the Canadian Masters Regional meet came to her hometown of Regina, Saskatchewan. She won the 100 and 200 at that meet.

Now, she's hooked. "I'm in this for life. I'm in it to stay healthy. I'm healthier than I was at 35," she said.

She plans to participate in the World Masters Association World Championships in Riccione, Italy, in September of 2007.

Ainsley Lovell, of Barbados, won W50 golds in distances ranging from the 200 to the 1500. She turned in a 30.07 in the 200, won the 400 (1:09.90) and 800 (2:43.95), and took silver in the standing long jump.

"I love distances," said Lovell, who turned in a 5:42.18 to win the 1500. "The only problem I have is the breathing. The altitude here. Otherwise, Utah is lovely."

Brent Long, Sandy, Utah, is a new-

comer to masters and senior games competition since turning 50, the lowest age in which senior games competition is allowed. Masters competition starts at age-30 for men and women.

Long won the M50 shot put with a 38-10 and took silver in the discus at 116-0. He stood and threw in both events

"I didn't think my knee would work," said Long, who injured his knee in high school and hasn't competed much since. "I'm learning. I'm coming back full force." He was accompanied by his father, Leo, who won the NCAA javelin championship for Stanford in 1955.

While some may question its validity, a team of women ranging in age from 80 to 91 established a W80-84 world record (3:51.85) in the 4x100.

John Galazin, a part-time resident of St. George and a Huntsman World Senior Games participant, said, "I went through the books and saw there was no record." So, Galazin went to his mother-in-law, 91-year-old Verla Shippen Ball, and suggested that she and her sisters get together on the track to establish one.

one.

"They told us we had to do two things – start and finish," said Ball's sister, Ruby Shippen Call, 83. She then added, "stay between the lines and not drop this [baton]."

Ball isn't new to Senior Games competition. She has competed for the past three years.

The youngest member of the team

was Nelda Shippen Reed, 80. Ava Shippen Hessing, 85, finished out the foursome.

"It's not been done before," Call said of the why of their record attempt. "We're all healthy. We're good friends who do things together."

Hessing said she was worried before the record attempt. "I was a little bit anxious when they first asked me, because I have an artifical hip. But I wasn't nervous when it came right down to it. It's been fun." The four sisters grew up in the small town of Menan, Idaho. Nelda and Verla live in the nearby towns of Rigby and Idaho Falls, while Ava lives in Boise. Ruby came from Tucson, Ariz.

Field event competition was delayed when heavy rains washed out the entire first day's schedule. Meet officials revamped the schedule, enjoyed two sunny days with high temperatures in the low 70s, and got numerous Games records and a few national-caliber performances.



BEST MALE ATHLETE

I am writing to question the headline on the front page of the November 2006 issue with regard to Bill Collins being selected for the IAAF 2006 Best Masters Athlete of the Year award.

Collins is an exceptional athlete, and did have a good season in 2006, following many other years of excellent performances. However, I would debate whether he is the "World's Best Male Masters Athlete."

My nomination for that award, certainly for 2006, would be Ed Whitlock, who set four world records on the track in a one-week period last July. Those details are on p. 16 of the September NMN: 5000m, 19:07.02; 10,000m, 39:25.16; 3000m, 11:10.43; and mile, 5:41.80.


Then, on Sept. 25, Ed broke the M75+ marathon world record with a 3:08:35 in the Toronto Waterfront Marathon. I haven't checked the

world records for all age-groups, but I doubt that very many athletes hold world records for the mile and the marathon, and three other distances in between. Ed's 5000 time is an agegraded 98.3%; his 10,000 is 98.6%.

I understand that all these records were run in meets and events in Canada, not in a WMA or other international meet. Therefore, Ed was not eligible for the IAAF award.

Collins is to be congratulated for his award, but the headline might better have described him as the best male masters athlete competing in a WMA event.

First Jump Pentathlon Lures Masters to Mobile

The University of South Alabama, Mobile, hosted the inaugural Port City Open and Masters Track & Field Meet and first ever Masters Jumpers Pentathlon on Oct. 14.

The JP included the 100mH, long jump, high jump, triple jump, and pole vault. In the M50 division, Bill Murray (3368), Jeff Watry (2542), and David Ortman (2430), the past three winners of the last four USA Masters Indoor Pentathlons, plus Richard Watson (1639) battled injuries and gravity.

Lyndell Farmer (3131) took the M55

contest. In the M60, Robert Baker (3882), a past masters indoor and outdoor pentathlon champion, edged Joe Johnston (3422), a masters indoor hurdles and high jump champion. The M65 winner was George Labelle (1897).

Some of the jump pentathletes also entered individual events with great success. Watson took firsts in the M50 hammer (41.84) and pole vault (2.40). Ortman won the M50 long jump (4.51), and Farmer, the M55 pole vault (3.30). Baker, M60, took firsts in the triple jump (9.52); high jump (1.46); and 200 (28.28).

But you have to take your hat off to Labelle, 67, who won both the M65 Jumpers Pentathlon and the Weight Pentathlon (2784), a total of ten different events, and then also had the best marks in eight M65 events.

Two Olympians were also in evidence with 1976 Olympian Jim Barrineau officiating the Jumpers Pentathlon high jump, then later winning the M50 high jump (1.77). Lee Evans, 1968 Olympian, now an assistant coach at U. of S.A., gave running advice while autographing Frank Murphy's book The Last Protest: Lee Evans in Mexico City.

The jumpers, coming from as far away as Illinois, Arizona, and Washington, thanked Meet Director Lyndell Farmer and Jumpers Pentathlon organizer, Bill Murray, for the great Alabama weather and hospitality.



U.S. Masters Capture Don Farquharson Cup

By BILL QUINLISK

New York's scenic Watkins Glen State Park, usually the location of NASCAR and Formula One auto racing, was host for the 29th Canada vs. USA Masters Cross-Country Challenge on Oct. 28.

The race was run over a sloppy 5K loop course, which traversed the hillside that parallels the famous gorge trail for which this Finger Lakes area is best known.

The first race in this series was run in 1977 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, and has been held annually since, except for 2000, the year in which the series founder, Canadian Don Farquharson, died. In 2005, the permanent trophy formerly called the

"Fleishmann Cup" was re-named the "Don Farquharson Cup."

Using the unique jointly-developed scoring system involving all five-year age divisions and both men and women runners, the USA prevailed over the small Canadian contingent by a score of 23 to 131. This marked the fourth USA victory in the last five years, although Canada still leads the series

The USA Masters squad was led by race winners Dave Bischoff (M44, 18:31) of the Genesee Valley Harriers, and Gillian Sharp (W45, 21:29) of the Finger Lakes Runners Club.

Top Canadian finisher was Jim Fullerton, (M40, 19:29) who was eighth overall.

Lokken, Harding First Masters in Detroit

Tracy Lokken, 41, won the masters contest by nine minutes in the Detroit Free Press/Flagstar Bank Marathon, Oct. 29. Lokken, from Michigan's Upper Peninsula city of Marquette, ran a seventh-place 2:27:58 at a 5:39 pace.

Paul Aufdemberge, 41, from nearby Redford, Mich., was second M40+ in 2:36:59. In the USA Masters Championships/Twin Cities Marathon, Oct. 1, he had finished second in 2:24:21. Matthew McCarthy, 40, of Livonia, a Detroit suburb, took third (2:46:31).

Julie Harding, 42, Lindsborg, Kans., won the women's masters race with a 3:02:33. C.J. Gardner, 42, Medina, Ohio, was second (3:09:41), and Krys Brish, 43, Milford, Mich., third (3:10:48).

The first three masters men and women won cash awards of \$750, \$500, and \$250.

In the half-marathon, David Wat-

kins, 45, Birmingham, Mich., was fifth overall in 1:16:26. Julie Winter, 45, Bloomfield, Mich., was the first W40+

Doug Goodhue, 64, Milford, Mich., won the M60 race (1:28:22). Grace Harrison, 60, Ann Arbor, Mich., took the W60 division (1:40:45).

With temperatures in the high 30s, the race started in downtown Detroit, proceeding to the Ambassador Bridge, crossing over the Detroit River to Windsor, Ontario, back to Detroit through the Detroit-Windsor Tunnel underneath the river and on to the river island park of Belle Isle at about the 17th mile for a short stint, and back to Detroit and the finish at Ford Field.

The event, which included a 5K fun run, drew 10,711 participants, with a breakdown of 5192 females and 5519 males.

Comparing Apples to Oranges

f any living human has researched and studied the whole area of amazing athletic feats more than Dale Harder, I have yet to hear of him or her. Harder, a 69-Lyear-old resident of Castro Valley, Calif., is the author of Strength & Speed, a book I drew from in last month's column. Among his other books is Sports Comparison. You Can Compare Apples to Oranges. (See www.strengthopedia. com for more information on his books.) A retired math and science teacher, Harder is a former world recordholder in age-group highland games and has fol-lowed strength and speed sports for more than 50 years. I recently put some questions to him by e-mail.

What prompted you to start collecting so many facts on such a variation of athletic feats?

'I've always been interested in facts, but when Roger Bannister broke the 4:00 mile, Parry O'Brien was first to exceed 60-0 in the shot put, and Charles Dumas was first to high jump 7-0, I really got interested. When Paul Anderson pressed 400 lb. overhead, I got turned on to weightlifting. Then I discovered books like Guinness World Records, World Almanac, Encyclopedia of Sports, People's Almanac, and Super Athletes."

Pro football commentators seem to think "athleticism" means sprinting 40 yards in 4.2, cutting on a dime, and leaping high over defenders. Do you agree with them?

"The short answer is yes. Of course there's also being able to kick a 50-yard field goal, boot a 60-yard punt, toss a 60-yard pass, run a passing route and receive a touchdown pass, block a punt, sack and/or a quarterback, run back a kick or punt for a touchdown, and intercept a pass."

Have you encountered the ultimate athlete? If so, who is he or she? If not, what would it take to be the ultimate athlete?

"Strength and Speed is a fun fact and record book, whereas another of my books, Sports Comparisons - You Can Compare Apples to Oranges, more properly attempts to compare athletes from different sports. The ultimate athlete will most likely change over time. World records keep getting broken, and by and large athletes are faster and stronger nowadays, and I suspect that trend will continue so I'm reluctant to identify an ultimate athlete."

If you could clone the ultimate athlete by taking certain physical attributes from various athletes of the past and present, who would you draw from

"I'll play Dr. Frankenstein to create the ultimate athlete. Take the brains of quarterback Joe Montana to improvise and adapt to any situation that may have arisen on the football field. Use Babe Ruth's eyes - scientists found that he had not only superior peripheral vision, but his vision was so acute that he could see the ball at least a tenth of a second sooner than Joe Sixpack and thus had a decided advantage in hitting

"Add the running legs and reflexes of sprinter Bob Hayes, the arm and shoulder strength of weightlifter Leonid Taranenko who clean and jerked 586 lb. Stir in the back and hip

strength of Andy Bolton, who dead lifted 971 lb. from the floor to his thighs. Blend in the coordination of Sergei Bubka who pole vaulted a world record

20-1.
"Bake in the abdominal strength of Cannonball Richards, who actually survived a cannonball being fired into his mid-section, on a daily basis. Clone the finger strength of Cyclops Bienkowski who bent coins in half in front of reputable witnesses.

"Add the neck strength of pro wrestler Kurt Angle. Incorporate the fighting of mixed martial arts world champion, Fedor Emelianenko, and you should have the ultimate athlete."

Of all the feats you've reported on, which do you find the most awesome in

"There's more about that in my sports comparison book. But, here are some great ones, not necessarily in order: Jan Zelezny's javelin throw of 323-1 (98.48m), because he's so far ahead of the next javelin competitor.

"Michael Johnson's 200m world record of 19.32 is impressive because of the difference of his mark and the next closest time. Javier Sotomayor's high jump of 8-0 1/2 (2.45m) seems to be well beyond the reach of current competitors.

"Sergei Bubka's 20-1 pole vault. Mike Powell's 29-4 1/2 long jump. Kevin Young's 46.78 in the 400m hurdles. Hicham El Guerrouj's 3:26 in the

1500m. Kenenisa Bekele's 26:17.53 in the 10,000m. My selections are based on statistical analyses, but please note the great competitive records of these

How about outside of track & field? "Wilt's 100 points in an NBA basketball game is impressive, but Bevo Francis scored 135 points in college, and Erman Kunter, TUR, scored 157 in the professional Pro-World league. So, one can't go purely by the number of points scored but must realistically consider the context.

"Having said that, here are some performances that I have analyzed, although not necessarily in order: Wilt's 100 points. Ernie Nevers' 40 points in one pro football game. Babe Ruth's 60 drug-free homers in a 154game season.

"Mieltxo Saralegui (pronounced meelt-show ser-uh-leg-way) a Basque stone lifter, lifted a 725 lb. rectangular block of stone from the ground to his shoulders. Leonid Taranenko clean and jerked 586 lb. Antonio Krastev snatched 476 lb. Shane Hamman squatted 1008 lb. for an IPF record."

Let's limit it to athletes over 40. Give me your top three performances there in track and field.

"It's hard to limit it to three, so here are some contenders: Eamonn Coghlan's 3:58.13 indoor mile. Johnny Gray's 1:48.41 800m. Andres Espinosa's 2:08:46 marathon. Al Oerter's 227-11 discus throw. Brian Oldfield's 70-3 shot put. Glen Conley's 7-0 1/2 high jump.

Outside of track & field?

"Karl Norberg did a 460 bench press at age 73, witnessed by Ed Lolax and other reliable folks. George Blanda, 43, had a miracle season in 1970. He won five games for the Oakland Raiders, including some amazing last minute finishes.


"He not only threw for TDs, he kicked the winning field goals in some of those games. Nolan Ryan, 44, pitched a no-hitter in 1991. Pudge Heffelfinger, 54, played 55 minutes of football against the College All-Stars.

'If that's not enough, at age 65 he played his last all-star game and was voted outstanding lineman on the field. Then there's Jack LaLanne. At age 70, handcuffed and shackled, he towed 70 boats with 70 people in Long Beach Harbor while fighting strong currents. Sam Snead, 84, shot a 71 for 18 holes of golf - 13 strokes below his age."

Who would get your vote as greatest all-around athlete ever?

"Jim Thorpe would be up there. He won the decathlon in the 1912 Olympics, setting a world record. He also won the pentathlon, took fourth in the high jump and seventh in the long jump. In 1912, as a college football player he scored 25 touchdowns and 198 points for the year. His ability in pro football was the deciding factor in its early success.

"In baseball, he hit three homers in one game and also played pro. He played all five positions in college basketball. He excelled in tennis, handball, gymnastics, figure skating, boxing, wrestling, shooting and swimming. He golfed in the low 80s. He was even intercollegiate ballroom champion.

"For the women, it's close with Jackie-Joyner Kersee, but I'd lean towards Babe Zaharias because of her broader versatility. She won honors in women's softball, went to the Olympics in track & field, broke world records in many different events, was the top pro women's golfer, starred in women's basketball, shooting, boxing, and many other sports."

Which track & field record now on the books do you think will stand the

"That's a tough question. No one can predict the future, but, I'll go with the 323-1 javelin throw. The 200m 19.32 by Michael Johnson is awfully tough, but we've got a real crop of world-class contenders coming on, so I'm not as sure about that one as I once

Orchard Park, N.Y., second M45 in 15:42, "The race really started going up the first steep hill just before the one mile mark when Brian charged and forced everyone to either go with him or be left behind. Only five of us went with him, but one-by-one he gapped us. He was just too strong."

Ayala-Troncoso, 47, Austin, Texas, also pushed the pace early. By the two-mile mark, reached in 11:28, she was away and clear of the women's field.

The 2004 race champion, Marisa Hanson, 43, Pleasant Valley, N.Y., with a 17:57, was the only other woman to break 18 minutes as the course proved slower than in previous years due to a coating of new gravel on several of the trail hills, dumped a week prior to the event by an overzealous state park employee.

Kathryn Martin, 55, Northport, N.Y., first W55, with a 19:11, finished in a virtual dead-heat with Ayala-Troncoso in the battle for the women's age-graded championships between previous USATF Masters Harriers-of-the-Year winners.

Troncoso, at 94.2%, edged out Martin, at 94.1%, for the title here. However, Martin has the advantage in the 2006 Harrier-of the-Year battle, as she was the top age-graded finisher at the Masters 8K XC race in NYC last February, where Ayala-Troncoso ran in the women's open race.

The W40+ team competition proved the closest of the meet as the Shore AC of New Jersey (20 points) edged the Finger Lakes RC (21) by one point for the title. The third-place squad from the Willow Street AC (28) narrowly squeezed by the West-chester TC (29), again by one point,

to take the bronze medals.

The Shore AC threesome with team places 5, 7 and 8, was led by Jill Evarts, 41, Middletown, N.J., 19:07. Finger Lakes RC placed 3, 6 and 12 in the team scoring and was led by Suzanne Myette, 49, Endicott, N.Y., 19:02.

In the separate M50+ race, defending champion Jim Robinson, 52, Rochester, N.Y., sixth (16:55), did not even medal in the very competitive M50 division. According to Robinson, winner Tom Ryan, 51, Cape Elizabeth, Me., "likes to run very aggressively right from the first step off the line."

Ryan had his hands full as seven veteran runners broke the 17-minute barrier and kept the pressure on for the entire race. In the end, Ryan was too strong for them all. Robinson had some consolation as he led his Genesee Valley Harriers team (73) to a ten-point win in defending their team title over their neighbors from the Finger Lakes RC (83).

In the final race of the day, the M60+, the ageless Bill Borla, 66, Torrington, Conn., ran stride for stride with youngster Robert Baker, 60, Loudon, Tenn., down the quarter mile home stretch, before finding an extra gear in the final 50 meters to garner another national title with an 18:44. Baker finished one second back in 18:45, both runners winning their respective five-year age divisions.

John Camelio, 60, Sandgate, Vt. (5th, 19:10), led his Greater Springfield Harriers (15) teammates to the M60+team title past the gracious host team from the Adirondack AC (27). Adirondack was led by Pat Glover, Clifton Park, N.Y. (4th, 18:56).

Ever inspiring Bob Matteson, 90, Bennington, Vt., took home the M90 title (37:10).

There were 280 finishers in the four races.



The Weight Room

It's Time to Claim Your 15 Minutes of Fame

The 2006 edition of the Masters Age Records book is now available. It lists world and U.S. single-age records by men and women, from ages 35 to 104 (in several cases) for track events, jumps, throws, combined events, and racewalks. It can be purchased through the National Masters News (see Publications Order Form on p. 11). The 60-page book was compiled by Peter Mundle, with help from Shirley Dietderich, who does the women's records, Rex Harvey, combined events, and Beverly McCall (née LaVeck), racewalks.

Before going any further with this, I should clarify that the marks in the book are not "records" but "bests," despite what the whole world, including Mundle and me, have been calling

them for years.

In the preface, Mundle gives an explanation, "Please be aware that these are single-age 'bests' and not official WMA or USATF records. Due to time constraints, these marks do not receive the same scrutiny as the official five-year age-group records that are published by the National Masters News. Thus, these 'bests' may differ from the official five-year records."

In scanning through the book, I noticed that there seem to be more recent records in the track events than in the throws. I don't think it's because throwers are not interested in potentially becoming immortalized by setting single-age records.

Maybe it's been easier for an athlete to run a race or jump and do the necessary paper work once the event is over, than it is for a thrower, who has to get the implement okayed, let the judges know when he is using the implement because it'll be of a different weight, which disrupts the flow of the event a little, and do the rest.

Testing the System

Just for the heck of it, I decided to see how much trouble it was to set a U.S. single-age record. I shouldn't be drawing attention to it, because it's a little weak, and some smart-aleck will spot it and erase my claim to fame.

I chose the 5kg hammer for age 72 and the Hayward Classic to do it in, a good meet to set any kind of a record because the officials are knowledgeable and accommodating, and the directors have set up a system to help with the paperwork necessary for records.

I had the 5kg implement approved; the officials brought it out with my 4kg that we were using in the M70-74 divi-sion, and I told the hammer officials what I was up to. After three throws with the 4kg, I threw the 5kg three times, and had the officials sign the record form. I submitted it to Mundle, and "Voila!" I had made the record book, after sweating out the time before the book was printed in case somebody else had a better mark.

Measurement Requirements

Mundle once had told me that a steel tape was not required for measuring single-age records, and I asked him recently if that was really true. This is his reply, "Throws do not have to be measured with a metal tape."

He also added that implements do not have to be impounded as they are for a five-year record, and, hang on to your seats, he said, "I don't need signa-tures of officials. I do need the date of birth of the athlete, the location and date of the meet, and the weight of the implement.

For the track people, he noted that he requires wind-readings for those events where they are needed, and an events sheet when the best performance is wind-aided and the next best in the series is not.

There you go, ladies and gents. The door is wide open. Evidently, you don't even need to fill out the usual application form.

Play It Safe

Just to be on the safe side, I would have the implement approved, include the weights and measurement person's signature and a copy of your birth certificate or passport, and maybe the name of the meet director and contact information in your application to Mundle. He also does the NMN monthly New Age-Group List and has many birth dates in his data bank, but not for every master in the world. His

contact info is on p. 2.

A reminder that this is not about five-year WMA or USATF official records. That's a whole other ball game with different rules and procedures, and is administered by Sandy Pashkin (contact info on p. 2).

Go For It

Buy the book, pick out an event in which you have a chance to earn a world or U.S. "record" for your age, do your best, and send your data to Mundle.

Chances are that you'll be listed in the next Masters Age Records book with Oneithea Lewis, Carol Finsrud, Faina Myelnik, Ruth Frith, Jane Frederick, Vanessa Hilliard, Helen Searle, Bernice Holland, Joan Stratton, Betty Jarvis, Christine Schultz, Edith Mendyka, Becky Sisley, Evaun Williams, Brian Oldfield, Joe Keshmiri, Ross Carter, Larry Stuart, the late George Frenn, Tom Gage, Bob Ward, Janis Lusis, Richard Rzehak, Tom Petranoff, Matt McGrath, Lance Deal, Leon Joslin, Nolan Fowler, James York, Arnolds Ticmanis, Phil Brusca, Carl Wallin, Bob Backus, Manuel White, John Whittemore (the 104-year-old), me (I hope), and a whole lot of others.

If your best marks are not listed, you can use the SUBMIT form to send those marks to Dave Clingan, Outdoor Rankings Coordinator. All submissions must include athlete name and date of birth; meet name, date, and location; and type of timing system used (FAT or hand, if applicable).

If necessary, results (with the above information) can be mailed to Dave Clingan, 1849 SE 20th, Portland, OR 97214.

The 2006 rankings will be published in the March issue of National Masters News.

Collins Named USATF Masters Athlete of the Year

Bill Collins, 56, Houston, Texas, is the recipient of the 2006 USATF Masters Athlete of the Year award. Collins was also named 2006 WMA Best Male Masters Athlete in October.

For his world records in the 60m and 200 at the 2006 WMA Indoor Championships in Germany, he was named the USATF Athlete of the Year on March 21, 2006.

He owns more than 80 masters national titles, 17 world masters crowns, and set nearly 20 world records in his masters career.

He joins USATF honorees, Kathryn Martin, W55, and Emil Pawlik, M65, who were chosen in 2004 and 2005, respectively.

ond last year ran better times to take division firsts. Dominique Chauvelier, of France, M50 winner, decreased his 2005 time (2:37:35) to 2:34:36.

Yoshio Nishino, of Japan, won the M75 race, after knocking off a huge amount of time from his 4:13:29 in 2005 to finish in 3:53:33. Peter Harangozo, 85, of New York, the only U.S. agegroup winner, also took a chunk from his M80-89 time of 7:43:47 last year to win that division with a 6:19:12

The first masters woman was also a division runner-up in 2005. Nathalie Vasseur, 41, of France, second W40 last year (2:45:58), improved to 2:45:15. Cristina Neri, 40, of Italy, finished in 2:47:37 for second. Stephanie Hodge, 41, of Canada, third (2:55:19), was the only other masters woman to break three hours.

Vasseur was three seconds behind Neri (1:22:02) at the halfway mark, but by the 40K point had built a two-minute lead.

Repeat winners were Sharon Vos, W50, of Connecticut, 3:05:24 (3:10:37, 2005); Francoise Decoray, W55, of France, 3:13:02 (3:08:02, 2005); and Ginette Bedard, W70, of New York, 3:53:36 (pending AR 3:46:18, 2005). Joan Rowland, better known by masters for her past racewalking achievements, won the W80-89 race in 6:29:50.

The overall winners were Marilson Gomes dos Santos, 29, of Brazil, 2:09:58, the first non-African winner of the New York City Marathon in 10 years, and Jelena Prokopcuka, 30, of Latvia, who successfully defended her title with a 2:25:05.

The race had 37,954 finishers of the 38,368 starters, and was run in temperatures in the low 40s and calm winds. Last year, 36,847 finished, with temperatures in the 60s at noon and high humidity.


Lance Armstrong, the seven-time winner of the Tour de France, running his first marathon, with the goal of under 3:00:00, drew the biggest cheers from the spectators and finished in 2:59:36. Armstrong, 35, said that the 26.2 mile race, especially the last eight miles, was the "hardest physical thing" he had ever done.

Burke Breaks Weight Record in Las Vegas at Nevada Senior Games

The Nevada Senior Games were held for the 26th time in Las Vegas. Again the track and field portion of the multi-sport event was at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas track on Sept. 29-Oct. 1.

Bill Burke, 66, who made the 1984 Olympic team as an M40+ and holds the M65 world records for the hammer (55.52) and weight, broke the latter mark (19.92/65-4.25) with a 20.18/66-2.5 on Saturday, Sept. 30. On Friday, he scored a meet's high 4835 points in the weight pentathlon, just 61 points below Bob Ward's U.S. record 4896 in 1998.

In other events, Lynn Naftel, W60, posted the meet's best times for women in winning the 100 (15.94), 200 (34.49), 400 (1:22.07), and 800 (3:39.60).

Margarid Hochstatter won the W70 800 (3:56.70) and 1500 (7:49.01).

Matt Kilpelainen, who holds the M60 U.S. pole vault record (3.83), set here last year, was top vaulter at 3.65/11-11.75.

John Galazin, M60, out-triple jumped everybody else, with a 9.35/30-8.25 and won the long jump (4.75/15-7)

Recent Nevada Senior Games have brought out good fields of throwers, who sign up to compete in the weight pentathlon on Friday, one of the last of the year, and then stick around to throw in the individual events and enjoy other types of Las Vegas entertainment. Richard Salisbury won the M65 shot put with a day's best 12.78/41-11.25. Bob Humphreys hit the 43.45/142-2 mark in the discus. In the M60 hammer, Tom Gage defeated Todd Taylor, 59.59/195-6 to 55.39/181-8. Both are world and/or U.S. age-group record holders.

Three record holders tangled in the W55 hammer, won by Joan Stratton (36.64/120-2) with Joyce Taylor, second (35.26/115-8) and Myrle Mensey, third (32.92/108-0). Mensey got even in the 16# weight, winning by two centimeters (11.75/38-6.75) from Taylor, with Stratton at 10.91/35-9 1/2.

In the M70 weight pentathlon, all three entries were over the coveted 4000 points, Humphreys at 4543, Chuck Polizzi at 4325, and Doug Tomlinson at 4081. Mensey, W55, was the top woman at 4031.

Louise Walters, W65, out-race-walked all others in the 1500 (9:25) and 5000 (32:51.00).

On The Run

Derek Turnbull (1926-2006) The Greatest Masters Runner in the World

n trying to assess the career of Derek Tumbull, it strikes me how relatively "mediocre" a runner Derek was in his youth. And how incredibly gifted a runner he became as he aged, arguably the greatest masters runner in the world.

It was not that Derek got faster as he moved through the decades. Everybody else got slower, much slower, while he did a better job of maintaining his fitness than any of his competitors.

Roger Robinson, who wrote an introduction to *The Fastest Old Runner in the World* (a biography of Derek by Vince Boyle), comments: "Derek was a 2:10-ish 880 runner in his youth, and continued to run that fast till his 50s. In his 70s, he set a world record for the 800 in 2:28, but he will be remembered mostly for his championships and records, particularly in the marathon."

25 World Records

During a masters career spanning three decades, Derek set 25 world records (many of them still standing) and won 28 world championships.

In the 1992 London Marathon, he ran 2:41:57, an M65 world record that trumps anything accomplished by today's younger elite. Derek first competed at the 1977 World Masters Championships in Gothenburg, Sweden, in the M50 division and won only a single medal: gold in the 1500.

His wife Pat recalls: "Derek ran two of his favorite events, the 5000 and 10,000, but failed to place in either. He entered the 1500 almost as an afterthought, figuring we had come all the way from New Zealand, so he might as well get his money's worth." His winning time in the 1500 was 4:23.5, a time he often bettered even as he aged.

World Record Times

At the 1997 Worlds in Durban, South Africa, at the age of 71, Derek won six individual gold medals, three of them in world record times. It stunned me at the 1985 Championships in Australia that he won the marathon in the morning, then returned to the track in the afternoon to run an exhibition mile.

Derek was five years (minus five months) older than me. He would move into the next age group before I entered it, thus, I unfortunately never had the opportunity to race him.

I would have considered it an honor to have run on the same track as him, to have finished behind him, even to have been lapped several times by him, a fate faced by so many other masters runners.

In the Woolshed

During a trip to New Zealand in 1997, my wife Rose and I visited Derek and Pat on their sheep farm near Invercargill, toward the bottom of the South Island. (The couple also ran a bed & breakfast.) When I called Derek the night before our arrival, he said that we probably would find him in the "woolshed." I had no clue what he meant at first.

Watching Derek stripping sheep of their wool the next day gave me an insight into what made him a great runner; his brute strength. Sheep ready to be sheared waited in a holding pen. Derek entered the pen and darted around until he could grab one.

He then flipped the 150-pound sheep onto its back and dragged it onto a dock, pinning one of the sheep's forelegs beneath his arm. Despite some bleating, the sheep took this abuse good-naturedly. Derek used electric shears to strip the sheep of its wool, then shoved it down a ramp to wait below before being led back to the fields.

Later, Derek drove us around those fields and through a forest reserve. I

asked him if this was where he did his training. Derek smiled tolerantly: "I don't train. I just run."

Weekend Runs

Reportedly, Derek ran mainly on weekends, long runs with his "mates," although Roger Robinson claims Derek trained harder than he sometimes admitted: "He always said at seminars we did together that he just ran 'when I like, where I like, and as I like,' but he used to rattle his dags most days pretty vigorously, if not systematically."

Derek Turnbull's last appearance at the Worlds was in 1997 in South Africa; after that he continued to run and compete, but cut back on his travel schedule. In 2001, he suffered a mild stroke while helping a neighboring farmer with heavy work.

"His death on November 2," says Pat Turnbull, "was unexpected but peaceful and with no sense of pain." He died while sleeping. The greatest masters runner in the world was 79 years old.

the world was 79 years old.

"The masters running community has lost one of its very best athletes," comments Jim O'Neil, a frequent competitor in the same age group as Derek.

"He had a truly remarkable career and will be sorely missed by everyone who knew him."

O'Driscoll Wins Fifth 5th Avenue Mile

Conor O'Driscoll should be nominated as the model for a "We're Getting Better with Age" poster campaign after repeating his 2005 masters win in the 2006 Continental Airlines Fifth Avenue Mile on Sept. 3.

In fact, O'Driscoll, 45, Rye, N.Y., claimed his fifth masters Fifth Avenue victory in a row with a 4:26, better than the 4:28 he ran last year in the M40 division.

O'Driscoll was the M45 1500 winner (4:15.50) in the 2006 USA Masters Championships, Charlotte, N.C., but, as a citizen of Ireland, could not claim a national title.

Peter Hegelbach, 42, of Colorado, was second M40+ (4:27) in the Fifth Avenue Mile.

Zofia Wieciorkowska, 43, Stratford, Conn., was third female overall in 5:03.0. Charlotte Rizzo, 44, Bronxville, N.Y., first W40+ in 2005 with a 5:15, posted a better 5:11, but had to settle for second W40+. Lorraine Jasper, 45, of Pennsylvania, was third W40+ (5:24).

Repeat age-group winners included Alston Brown, 57, who, despite being unable to train well because of a broken foot suffered two months ago, won the M55 race with a 4:51 (4:46 in 2005), holding off Harold Nolan, 59, second in 4:59. Nolan was second in 2005 with a 5:24.

Hosted again by the NYRR, the race was run on the world-famous thoroughfare, starting at East 80th Street and finishing at East 60th. Pleasant Autumn weather with temperatures in the mid-60s and humidity at 45% brought out throngs of spectators, who watched nearly 3000 runners compete in 12 age-division races.

The crowd was particularly taken

with runners in the George Sheehan Memorial Mile, featuring athletes age 60-and-over. Bryan Pearsall, 60, won the men's race in 5:22. Marie-Louise Michelsohn, who turned 65 a week later, won the W60+ in 6:15. Michelsohn is the 2006 W60 outdoor champion in the 400, 800 and 1500.

Spectators roared for David Gerli, wearing #95, his age, as he legged out an 18:58 mile, with the assistance of a walker.

Age-group performance honors went to Michelsohn, who topped everybody with a 96.9%, and Ginette Bedard, W70, who ran a 3:53:36, second at 93.2%. Brown (92.6%), O'Driscoll (91.9%), and Nolan (91.7%) were the top three M40+ performers.

The George Sheehan Mile was organized by Al Puma. Reebok provided a special prize for the first three finishers in each age group.

· Marja Bakker, an organizer of the Boston Marathon and the only woman to be president of the Boston Athletic Association Running Club, died Oct. 14 at her home in Medford, Mass. She was 59. The cause was cancer, said Jack Fleming, a spokesman for the club. Bakker joined the 119-year-old BAA Running Club in 1978 and became its president in 1982. In 1984, she was elected to the club's board of governors, the first woman to serve. In 1987, she became staff administrator of the Boston Marathon, a position she held until recently. Bakker also served on the board of governors for USA Track & Field-New England, the regional governing body for the sport of road running and track and field. She was named a member of the executive committee of women's long-distance run-ning of USA Track & Field, the national organization, and she was part of the national organization's championships site selection subcommittee. Bakker was born in Vlaardingen, The Netherlands, on April 20, 1947, and was a Dutch citizen. The Boston Marathon has coincided 16 times with her birthday, according to the BAA. She was born the day after the 1947 Boston Marathon, when the event's first world record was set. Earlier this year, the BAA made a successful bid, largely facilitated by Bakker, to play host to the women's

marathon for the United States Olympic trials in April 2008.


