In the California Relays at Modesto May 23, Ray Hiscok put the shot a lifetime best 59'6". Competing against most of the nation's best, Ray missed the finals by inches and finished 8th. Ed Hanks was able to clear only 6'6" in the high jump and finished far down. At the SPAAU at Occidental College May 29 Ed jumped 6'9", placing second on misses to Steve Lang of UCLA.

In a special mile race at the Women's PSAAU Meet May 14, Betty Wake won with 5:51 as Donna Gookin placed thrid at 6:10. Susan Schalkwijk won the 3000 meters with 12:15.

PSAAU Track Championships, Balboa Stadium, May 30

Off to a bad start when the La Jolla Youth Meet didn't relinquish the track for several hours past the scheduled time, the PSAAU meet got back on schedule by cancelling the 6-mile run and finished with as good a 2-mile race as you'll ever see. Ed Hanks and Ray Hiscock continued to lead SDTC by winning their specialties, Hanks with a meet record. Bud Held was the day's oldest winner with a good 211'8" in the javelin. New club member Ron French stepped a quick 14.0 hurdle race and sprinter Daryl Lassen made a good 1:56.3 880 debut. that 2-mile, SDTC member Charlie Winsor of SDSC ran 8:51.0 for 4th place.

The meet also saw three new SDTC Senior Division records: 880--Don Coleman 2:13.7 (old record 2:15.4, Coleman, 7/5/69); 100--Don Love 10.8 (old record 11.1, Merle Hamilton 7/19/68, Bob McDonald 7/4/69, Love 8/30/69); 220--Don Love 24.6 (old record 24.9, Love 8/30/69).
